



The distribution of waters of the Indus and its tributaries between India and Pakistan is governed by the **Indus Water Treaty (IWT)**.

Was signed on **Sept 19, 1960**, between India, Pakistan and a representative of **World Bank** after eight years of negotiations.

Partition of India cut across the **Indus river basin**, which has the Indus river, plus five of its main tributaries.

Explanation: - **Neom City** is located on the **coast of the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aqaba**. It is a planned megacity in Tabuk Province, northwestern Saudi Arabia. The city is designed to be a sustainable and technologically advanced hub for businesses and tourism.

- The Red Sea is a long, narrow body of water that separates Africa from Asia. It is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world, due to its beautiful beaches, crystal-clear waters, and diverse marine life.
- The **Gulf of Aqaba is a northern extension of the Red Sea**. It is **bordered by Saudi Arabia, Jordan, and Egypt**. The Gulf of Aqaba is also a popular **tourist destination**, known for its **coral reefs, diving spots, and historic sites**.
- Neom City is still under development, but it is expected to be completed by 2030. The city is expected to have a population of 1.5 to 2 million people.

Explanation: Egypt, officially the Arab Republic of Egypt, is a transcontinental country spanning the northeast corner of Africa and southwest corner of Asia via a land bridge formed by the Sinai Peninsula.

- It is bordered by the **Mediterranean Sea** to the north, the **Gaza Strip of Palestine and Israel** to the northeast, the **Red Sea to the east, Sudan** to the south, and **Libya** to the west.
- Egypt's important role in geopolitics stems from its strategic position: a **transcontinental nation**, it possesses a land bridge (the Isthmus of Suez) between Africa and Asia, traversed by a navigable waterway (the Suez Canal) that connects the Mediterranean Sea with the Indian Ocean via Red Sea.
- The **Gulf of Aqaba** in the northeast separates Egypt from **Jordan and Saudi Arabia**.
- **Cairo** is the capital and largest city of Egypt.
- The **Nile River** is the longest river in Africa. It flows through **Egypt** from south to north and empties into the **Mediterranean Sea**. The Nile River has been essential to Egyptian civilization for thousands of years.

Significance: *India and Egypt are enhancing bilateral ties by strategic cooperation in field of skill development, as part of their broader Strategic Partnership established in 2023.*

A-18 The Correct Answer is: a) 1 and 2 only

Explanation: - **Tuti Island** is located at the **confluence of the Blue Nile and White Nile**, a highly significant geographical feature that forms the **Nile River proper**.

- It is located within the **capital city of Khartoum, Sudan**, bordered by three **cities—Khartoum, Omdurman, and Khartoum North**.
- The island lies in a **semi-arid region** and is not densely forested or known for heavy rainfall; its vegetation is primarily agricultural in nature, including vegetable and fruit farms.

Significance: *Since the outbreak of civil war on April 15, 2023, between Sudanese Army and Rapid Support Forces (RSF), Tuti Island has been devastated by violence and occupation.*

Explanation: -The **White Nile and Blue Nile** meet at **Khartoum, the capital of Sudan**.

- Sudan shares borders with **Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Central African Republic, Chad, and Libya — total of 7 countries**.
- Sudan lies at the **transition** between **the Sahara Desert in the north** and **the Sahel in the south**.

Explanation: - The **Blue Nile and the White Nile converge** at the **city of Khartoum in Sudan** to **form the Nile River**. The **White Nile originates in Lake Victoria** and runs through several East and Central African countries, while the **Blue Nile originates in Ethiopia** and runs through Ethiopia and Sudan before meeting the **White Nile in Khartoum**. The **Nile River** then flows through Sudan and Egypt, **emptying** into the **Mediterranean Sea**.
